

Year 2 Writing Non-negotiables

- a) Write most sentences with capital letters and full stops and with some use of question marks and exclamation marks. **Eg That was an amazing film!**
- b) Use different types of sentences in their writing (statements, questions, exclamations and commands). **Eg The clown visited school.** (statement) **He was very funny!** (exclamation)
- c) Use some expanded noun phrases to describe and specify. **Eg The funny** (adjective) **clown** (noun) **visited our school.**
- d) Use of present and past tense is mostly correct and consistent through a piece of writing. **Eg The football match is on Thursday. I hope I score a goal.** (present)
The football match was on Thursday. I scored a goal.(past)
- e) Use co-ordination (or / and / but) and some subordination (when / if / that / because). **Eg I like apples and oranges.** (coordination) **I will play outside if it is sunny.** (subordination)
- f) Segment spoken words into phonemes (**sounds**) and represent these by graphemes (**writing the words**), spelling many correct. **Eg th-i-s = this**
- g) Spell many common exception words.
- h) Spell some words with contracted forms. **Eg do not= don't**
- i) Add suffixes to spell some words correctly in their writing e.g. **-ment, -ness, -ful, -less, -ly*** **Eg quiet+ly=quietly**
- j) Use the diagonal and horizontal strokes needed to join letters in some of their writing.

Year 2 Maths Non-Negotiables

- 2.1) Compare and order numbers to 100. **Eg $45 < 52$ (45 is less than 52)**
- 2.2) Count on and back in 1's and 10's from any number under 100.
- 2.3) Know by heart 2, 5 and 10 table facts and related division facts. **Eg $5 \times 3 = 15$, $15 \div 5 = 3$, $15 \div 3 = 5$**
- 2.4) Recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number. **Eg 36 has 3 tens and 6 ones**
- 2.5) Know and use number bonds and families to 20.
Eg $13 + 7$, $11 + 9$, $8 + 12$
- 2.6) Know all 10's number pairs to 100. **Eg $30 + 70$**
- 2.7) Tell the time to half and quarter hour. **Eg quarter past five, quarter to four, half past two.**
- 2.8) Recognise, find, name and write fractions $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{3}$, $\frac{2}{4}$, $\frac{3}{4}$, $\frac{1}{2}$ of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity
- 2.9) Calculate:
