

Year 3 Writing Non-negotiables

- a) Spell most words using **containing taught patterns** and many common exception words from Y3/4 word list.
- b) Identify spelling roots in longer words
Eg electricity, helpful
- c) Improve the legibility, consistency and quality of their handwriting
- d) Proof-read writing for spelling and punctuation errors
Ie checking through their own work
- e) Use all punctuation taught previously (full stops, capital letters, question marks, exclamations, commas in lists) **Eg. The four children were called David, Emma, Lisa and Robert.**
- f) Use inverted commas to punctuate direct speech. **"Hello there!"**
- g) Use apostrophes for contractions and possessive
Eg. Can +not =can't (contraction)
Helen's pencil (possessive) The pencil belonging to Helen.
- h) Express time, place and cause using:
Conjunctions (when, before, after, while, so, because),
Eg. Before eating lunch, I wash my hands.
Adverbs (then, next, soon, therefore)
Eg. Soon, we will play football.
Prepositions (before, after, during, in, because of)
Eg. During art, we created masks.
- i) Use headings and sub-headings to aid presentation
- j) Use the present perfect form of verbs, instead of the simple past
Eg. 'He has gone out to play' rather than 'He went out to play'
- k) Planning, drafting, writing, evaluating and editing their writing with simple notes.
ie improving their work independently.

Year 3 Maths Non-Negotiables

- 3.1) Read, write and order numbers and numerals to 1000
Eg. Read these numbers - 230, 415, 709. Write these numbers - one hundred and fifty two, three hundred and nine. Order these numbers from smallest to largest - 238, 176, 501, 382
- 3.2) Count on or back in 1's, 10's and 100's from any number less than 100
Eg. Count in tens forward from 36, Count in hundreds backwards from 981
- 3.3) Mentally, add and subtract 1 and 2 digit numbers.
Eg. Add these numbers mentally - 6, 8, and 3. Add 36 and 23. Subtract mentally - 70 and 25
- 3.4) Know by heart 3 and 4 table facts and division facts
Eg. $3 \times 4 = 12$, $4 \times 3 = 12$, $12 \div 4 = 3$, $12 \div 3 = 4$
- 3.5) Explain value of digits up to 1000
Eg. 357 is 3 hundreds, 5 tens and 7 ones
 $357 = 300 + 50 + 7$
- 3.6) Multiply 1 and 2 digit numbers by 10 and 100
Eg. 3×10 , 3×100 , 25×10 , 25×100
- 3.7) Know number pairs that total 100 (and subtraction facts)
Eg. $60 + 40 = 100$, $40 + 60 = 100$, $100 - 60 = 40$, $100 - 40 = 60$
 $23 + 77 = 100$, $77 + 23 = 100$, $100 - 77 = 23$, $100 - 23 = 77$
- 3.8) Tell the time to the nearest 5 minutes
Eg. Five past two, ten to six, twenty five past ten, twenty to seven
- 3.9) Find simple fractions ($\frac{1}{3}$, $\frac{1}{5}$ and $\frac{1}{10}$) of shapes and amounts
Eg. What is $\frac{1}{3}$ of 12? What is $\frac{1}{5}$ of 30?  Colour $\frac{1}{3}$ of this shape
- 3.10) Add and subtract fractions with the same denominator within one whole
Eg. $\frac{1}{5} + \frac{3}{5} =$ $\frac{7}{8} - \frac{3}{8} =$
- 3.11) Calculate:
- TU+TU (bridging 100) **$76 + 47$** TU-TU **$84 - 36$**
- HTU+TU/HTU (not bridging 1000) **$436 + 359$** HTU-TU/HTU **$675 - 223$**
- TU÷U (where the divisor is 2,3,4,5,6 or 10) **$75 \div 5$** TUxU **23×4**
