Class Updates

Nursery - This week, Nursery will carry on thinking about Autumn. We're going to have a go at some writing - what we know about Autumn and bake some Autumn biscuits.

Reception – This week in Reception we are learning all about Autumn. We will be going on an Autumn walk, observing and discussing the changes that occur at this time of year. We will be finding out about animals such as hedgehogs and squirrels and writing some facts. In Maths this week we are learning to name and describe some 2D shapes.

Year 1 – In Year 1 this week we will be creating dragons from egg boxes and writing instructions about this. If you have any empty egg boxes at home, please could they be brought in? The children will also be creating paintings of vegetables ready for our Harvest Festival!

Year 2 – In Literacy this week we are continuing to look at the text 'Small Knight and George and the Royal Chocolate Cake'. We will be focusing on the chocolate cake (of course)!! In particular, looking at instructions of how to make one. We will practice by creating some instructions to make jam sandwiches and then seeing if we can follow them. If these instructions are tasty enough, hopefully we can make some chocolate cakes!! In Maths we will be using dienes to continue adding two digit numbers and drawing bar models and part whole models to support our learning. We will be finding missing numbers and experimenting with moving the equals sign around in the sum.

Year 3 – In Year 3, we will be continuing our excellent work on addition in Maths. In Literacy, we are creating an information text built around our Science text 'The Street beneath our Feet'. In Science, we are continuing with our fossils mini topic. The children have brought in some super fossils already. If you have

some at home that you would like to share, please bring them in. Just a reminder, PE kits should be in school for Thursday and Fridays. Thank you.

Year 4 –This week in Year 4 we will be continuing our persuasive writing building up to us creating a persuasive letter for the BFG to read. In Maths we are going to be starting our unit on addition and subtraction, using concrete resources to support our understanding.

Year 5 - This week in Year 5 we will be exploring the human and physical characteristics of Hamburg in Germany and Newcastle in the UK. We will be making comparisons to help us to understand the similarities and differences. In Literacy our writing will be linked to our topic and we will continue with our place value topic in Maths.

Year 6 – The week has finally arrived... East Barnby residential! We have a fun-packed week of fantastic outdoor activities planned, including mountain biking, beck scrambling and canoeing on the River Esk! Check out Facebook during the week for updates. We are all really excited about our week of outdoor adventures!
