## UNICEF Fundraising Event

## School Meals

Due to the increase in costs set by North Yorkshire County Caterers, we will now be charged £2.45 for every meal that we serve from September. Unfortunately, we have no choice but to increase the price of our school meals to £12.25 per week (£2.45 per day) from 3<sup>rd</sup> September 2019 (it is currently £12.00 per week/£2.40 per day).

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will still benefit from the Governments Universal Infant **Free School meals**.

The Government also offers children the opportunity to benefit from a **free** school meal if parents are in receipt of any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get).

## Class Updates

Nursery – After meeting our new starters on Tuesday morning, Nursery are going to start sorting out and packing! The children will help us go through our toys and see which ones we need to pack up and take with us. Our new sound is 'd' - the sound bag is waiting!! This week you will receive a letter about the Nursery Sports Day and family picnic.

Reception – This week in Reception we are going to be talking about the farm and thinking about what we will see and do on our trip to Monk Park Farm. Later in the week we will then be writing a recount of our trip and all the things we did. In Numeracy we are going to be looking at patterns using both shapes and numbers and using the threading beads to make a pattern.

Year 1 – This week we are continuing to focus on measure during our Maths lessons - specifically weight. We are also revisiting multiplication and sharing - solving problems using equipment to help. During our writing sessions, we are looking at adding the suffix -ing to words and also writing invites to a flea's party! In Science we will be learning about the different animal groups, for example, mammals, reptiles and amphibians to name a few! In Topic, we will start to design some bug hotels which we will create and then put around school, but mainly in the wildlife area! Also, on Thursday morning, the children will spend some more time with Mrs Burland completing some transition tasks ready for Year 2.

Year 2 – Our Literacy this week will be linked to our History. We will continue to learn about the discoveries of Charles Darwin and will write an exciting newspaper report to share all his findings. We will also continue to work on our common exception words. In Maths Mrs Bailey will help us with position and direction and Mrs Burland will start counting in 3's with us and work on reasoning questions. Our Science this week is all about mini-beast habitats.

Year 3 – Year 3 are looking forward to their trip tomorrow at York Museum. We cannot wait to take part in the Roman workshops and to extend our learning about Romans. We are doing more practice of the grid method for multiplication and doing word problems to extend our learning. We are learning the songs for the Summer performance and learning some dance moves to go along with them. We are having our termly Art day with Mr Moss and will be doing more of our DT project.

Year 4 & 5- In Years 4 and 5 we are very much looking forward to our school trip to York on Tuesday. From this experience, we will be producing some high quality writing. On Thursday, we are all looking forward to UNICEF day. We hope to see you there too!

Year 6 – Year 6 have a very busy week. We have started today with our termly Art day with Mr Moss - we cannot wait to see what they have produced. We have Bikeability for the first group of children this week too (tomorrow and Wednesday). The children not taking part in Bikeability will be making their Roman catapults. We will also be spending time on researching our Summer production ready to showcase all our acting and singing skills. Our weekly Forest School session will be taking part on Friday afternoon as usual.
