Practice counting out groups of a given number  
Practice finding different ways of making a number (knowing that 3+2, 1+4, 0+5 etc. all make 5)




**Technology**

**Knowledge and Understanding**

Spend time looking at how things change as the season changes; how do the trees look different? What is happening to birds and chicks? What else can you find that changes?

Look at maps (google earth or the maps on phones are particularly good) – can you find familiar places? Trace the routes that you take regularly? Find somewhere you went on holiday?

**Expressive Arts and Design**

Use your toys at home to make up a story – maybe your teddies could rescue another toy, or go exploring around the house – what would they find?

Learn a new song together – can you video a performance and email it to school? Or to a family member? Maybe your child could make up a dance routine!



Do you know anyone who has had a birthday during the lockdown? How have they celebrated? I bet it was bit different to what would normally happen!

When you are doing some writing, remember these things;

1. Count how many words are in the sentence you want to write.
2. Listen to all the sounds in the words.
3. Leave a space in between each word.
4. Write as neatly as you can.
5. Put a full stop at the end of your sentence.

Read, read and read! Listen to as many stories as you can, have a go at reading some of the words – your grown up will help you if you get stuck. You could try and read your favourite story all by yourself – I bet you nearly know it anyway!
