Therefore, we insist that children read to an adult at home at least 5 times a week and we celebrate this regular reading with our High 5 Reader competition. Please continue to sign the reading record to indicate every time your child has read. Reading records will be checked weekly to record and celebrate High 5 Readers! Let's make a fantastic start to the school year with lots of High 5 Readers!

Homework

This term's homework grid has been shared along with this letter. Please encourage your child/children to complete all of the challenges throughout the term as they have been designed to enhance and consolidate their learning in school. The challenges can be completed in any order and brought into school as they are completed to display in the classrooms. We love to receive all their great work!

Reading Plus or Reading Eggs should be used at home as often as possible to further support your child/children's reading. It has been proven that children make more rapid progress with their reading when accessing the program more regularly. Timestable Rockstars, which is an individualised program to support children in practising their tables, should also be used regularly at home to ensure children can confidently recall multiplication and division facts up to 12 x 12.


Topic 🛉

The theme of this term's topic is 'Journeys'. In Geography, we will be learning about North America

developing an understanding of geographical similarities and differences with the United Kingdom. This is recapping and building on the children's prior knowledge and understanding of types of settlements, land use, farming, climate and fair trading. We will be learning about **Evolution and Inheritance** and **Light** in Science lessons. The topic mat provides the knowledge, vocabulary and key texts for this term, for you to share your child's/children's learning and support them at home.



Our Class text



This term, we will be reading the text Wonder by R.L Palacio. Through reading this inspiring story, we will explore PHSCE themes such as building relationships and accepting difference, as well as enhance our evolution and inheritance learning in Science. As our Geography topic this term is North America and Wonder is set in New York city, USA, the story provides lots of opportunities to explore a North American city too.

PE and Forest School

Year 5 have PE on **Tuesday and Friday** this term.
