

IMPORTANT KNOWLEDGE – 5 FINGER FACTS

<b>Oesophagus</b>	The part of the alimentary canal which connects the throat to the stomach	I know the oesophagus, the stomach , the large and small intestine are important in digestion.
<b>Canine Teeth</b>	A pointed tooth between the incisors and premolars of a mammal, often greatly enlarged in carnivores.	I know humans have different types of teeth – incisors, canines, pre molars and molars.
<b>Incisor Teeth</b>	A narrow-edged tooth at the front of the mouth, adapted for cutting. In humans there are four incisors in each jaw.	A foetus is formed when a sperm meets an egg.
<b>Foetus</b>	An unborn or unhatched offspring of a mammal, in particular an unborn human more than eight weeks after conception.	Puberty is a stage of development between childhood and adulthood.
<b>Gestation</b>	The process or period of developing inside the womb between conception and birth.	I understand that gestation means the time between conception and giving birth.



HISTORY – The Victorians: Crime and Punishment

IMPORTANT KNOWLEDGE – 5 FINGER FACTS

<b>Pickpockets</b>	A person who steals from people's pockets.	The British Empire was countries which were ruled by Queen Victorian in Britain, making her the most powerful monarch in the world at the time.
<b>British Empire</b>	All the places around the world that were once ruled by Britain	Common crimes during the Victorian era were theft (including pick-pocketing) and political crimes, <i>such as striking, rioting and destroying industrial machinery</i>
<b>Industrial</b>	A group of businesses that make or sell similar products or perform similar services.	Most crimes were punished by people going to prison or being sent to Australia for forced labour.
<b>Reformatory schools</b>	A youth detention centre to provide the children with industrial, moral and educational training	The Victorian era was from 1837 – 1901.
<b>Transportation</b>	The act of carrying from one place to another	Public hangings were also used as a punishment until 1868, then later done in private prisons until the last one in 1963.

IMPORTANT KNOWLEDGE – 5 FINGER FACTS

<b>Faith</b>	Trust in something that has never been proved.	Many people believe that being part of a religious or non-religious community can have a positive impact on their everyday life.
<b>Religious community</b>	Gatherings of individuals who have common religious beliefs.	Many people believe faith and beliefs to be different things: religious people have faith and non-religious people have beliefs.
<b>Non-religious communities</b>	Have members who are from different religions, or who are not religious eg. a range of clubs & groups.	Many Beliefs are shared by more than one religion. For example, praying at regular times of the day, not eating certain foods and not saying bad things about God.
<b>Influence</b>	To affect or change in an indirect but usually important way.	Members of religious communities can also be part of other non-religious communities and this can sometimes cause difficulties because of their beliefs.
<b>Atheist</b>	Someone who is not a member of any religion and does not believe in any Gods.	Sometimes people can find it difficult to live up to their own beliefs.
