

IMPORTANT KNOWLEDGE – 5 FINGER FACTS

Circulatory system	A system which includes the heart, veins, arteries and blood transporting substances around the body.
Blood vessels	The tube-like structures that carry blood through the tissues and organs. Veins, arteries and capillaries are the three types of blood vessels.
Oxygenated blood	Oxygenated blood has more oxygen. It is pumped from the heart to the rest of the body.
Deoxygenated blood	Deoxygenated blood is blood where most of the oxygen has already been transferred to the rest of the body.
Nutrients	Substances that animals need to stay alive and healthy.

Mammals have hearts with four chambers
Blood that has come from the body is deoxygenated , and the blood that has come from the lungs is oxygenated again.
Arteries carry oxygenated blood away from the heart and Veins carry deoxygenated blood toward the heart.
Blood transports gases, nutrients and waste products.
Regular exercise strengthens muscles including the heart muscle; improves circulation and increases the amount of oxygen around the body



HISTORY – The Victorians: Crime and Punishment

IMPORTANT KNOWLEDGE – 5 FINGER FACTS

Pickpockets	A person who steals from people's pockets.
British Empire	All the places around the world that were once ruled by Britain
Industrial	A group of businesses that make or sell similar products or perform similar services.
Reformatory schools	A youth detention centre to provide the children with industrial, moral and educational training
Transportation	the act of carrying from one place to another

The British Empire was countries which were ruled by Queen Victorian in Britain, making her the most powerful monarch in the world at the time.
Common crimes during the Victorian era were theft (including pick-pocketing) and political crimes, <i>such as striking, rioting and destroying industrial machinery</i>
Most crimes were punished by people going to prison or being sent to Australia for forced labour.
The Victorian era was from 1837 – 1901.
Public hangings were also used as a punishment until 1868, then later done in private prisons until the last one in 1963.

Faith	Trust in something that has never been proved.
Religious community	Gatherings of individuals who have common religious beliefs.
Non-religious communities	Have members who are from different religions, or who are not religious eg. a range of clubs & groups.
Influence	To affect or change in an indirect but usually important way.
Atheist	Someone who is not a member of any religion and does not believe in any Gods.

Many people believe that being part of a religious or non-religious community can have a positive impact on their everyday life.
Many people believe faith and beliefs to be different things: religious people have faith and non-religious people have beliefs.
Many Beliefs are shared by more than one religion. For example, praying at regular times of the day, not eating certain foods and not saying bad things about God.
Members of religious communities can also be part of other non-religious communities and this can sometimes cause difficulties because of their beliefs.
Sometimes people can find it difficult to live up to their own beliefs.
