There is a dangerous new app linked to Snapchat called 'Send it' which has put children at risk of exploitation and bullying. We have had reports and incidents across the school as a result of pupils following or talking to people who are not known to them online, and they are playing on games/accessing apps that have age restrictions beyond their actual age. # What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

Sendit is an add-on to Snapchat, not a standalone app: It requires users to have an active Snapchat account, which they then connect to Sendit. It's important that trusted adults realise, therefore, that any risks associated with Snapchat also affect children using Sendit. Within the app, people play question games like Truth or Dare' and 'Never Have I twer': users select a question to share on their Snapchat story for their friends to reply to. All responses are anonymous, although – for paying subscribers – Sendit reveals hints about who sent which messages.
