Dear Parents and friends,



As we enjoy a bit of sunshine (finally) and spring flowers in our grounds it seems like a long time since the beginning of term! In some ways it seems to have flashed by and I can't believe the Easter holidays are here! What a term it has been - starting with a Y6 Residential to Marrick Priory and visits to Fountains Abbey (with appearances on Channel 4 News), Ripon Library trips for all classes, our Month of Reading Madness, Science Week, Maths afternoon, Reading Cafes, our Holi Run for Charity (another news appearance!) and our Mother's Day Afternoon Tea being some highlights....! The Key Stage 2 showcase today and our poetry performances have been a wonderful end to the term! The children (and staff) have worked incredibly hard, engaging in their learning across the curriculum and taking part in some great extra-curricular school clubs and community events this term! I am really, REALLY proud of them all.

This week we have all been learning poems to perform and I hope you have been able to watch some of the rehearsals on our school Facebook page! I can't believe how many of them remembered ALL the words and actions. We have also been learning about the Easter story and the specific events of Holy Week with a carousel of exciting activities including making some great Easter gardens. It was lovely to see our older and younger children working so well together in their groups.

#### Breakfast

This Easter, Kellogg's has partnered with Morrisons to launch a breakfast club where the whole family can request a free bowl of cereal. Both adults and children can choose from a bowl of Cornflakes, Rice Krispies or Coco Pops, with a choice of dairy and non-dairy milk, when they order a 'Kellogg's breakfast' before 11am, in any of Morrisons 397 cafés. This joint initiative will run from 3rd to 24th April, while stock lasts, and aims to support families during the Easter holidays when many school breakfast clubs are unavailable.

#### **School Meals UPDATE**

Unfortunately, due to the rising cost of inflation and the high increase in food costs, we have been informed TODAY that the cost of our school meals will be increasing to £2.85 per day after the Easter holidays.

This increase is out of our control and has been set by North Yorkshire County Caterers.

Please remember that all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to free school meals under the Government's Universal Infant Free School Meal Scheme.

For children in Years 3 – 6, if you get certain benefits, your child may qualify for free school meals. To qualify you must be receiving:

- Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods (£616.67 per month)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are also not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual household gross income that does not exceed £16,190 (as assessed by HMRC)
- Working Tax Credit run-on, paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

#### **Attendance**


