The Summer Reading Challenge 2023!



Children can once again sign up for the Summer Reading Challenge at their local library during the holidays. This year the theme is Ready... Set... Read! and is all about the power of play, sport, games and physical activity. The challenge for children is to read 6 library books of their choice and collect special stickers and other prizes along the way – everyone who finishes will receive a limited-edition Ready Set Read! medal and a certificate. Any child aged 4 to 11 can join in and the challenge runs from Saturday 15th July until Saturday 9th September.

It will be presented by Rachel Comerford, Specialist Lead for Communication & Interaction in North Yorkshire and will consider the following questions:

-What is sensory integration?

-Why do people respond differently to their environment?

-What is the purpose behind actions?

-Is it ok to intervene and how do we go about it?

-How can we develop self-regulation?
