SCIENCE - LIGHT		IMPORTANT KNOWLEDGE (Five Finger Facts)	
opaque	Does not let light through.	Light is needed in order to see things and dark is the absence of light	
translucent	Some light travels through but objects on the other side are not clear.	Light travels in straight lines and when it hits an object, it is reflected into our eyes in order for us to see it.	
transparent	Light can pass through and objects are clear on the other side.	Some surfaces reflect light well such as smooth, shiny and flat surfaces; other surfaces do not reflect light as well, such as rough uneven surfaces.	
shadow	A dark outline caused by an object blocking out a light source.	Light from the sun can be dangerous; I can protect my eyes by wearing a hat with a wide brim and sunglasses with a UV rating.	
reflective	A surface that allows light to bounce off it.	Shadows are formed when the light from a light source is blocked by a solid object.

Diya	Small oil lamp, usually made from clay.	Diwali is a festival celebrated by Hindus known as the Festival of Lights.	Remembrance Day

Hindu	Hindus believe in one supreme God who created everything in the universe.	During Diwali, Rangoli patterns are created on the floor to welcome the goddess, Lakshmi.	
Lakshmi	The goddess of money, wisdom and good luck in Hinduism.	During Diwali, Hindus share presents, cards and sweets with their family and friends.	
Mendhi	Body art that involves designs being drawn on a person's skin - hands and feet.	Candles are lit known as diyas which are a symbol of goodness.
