Evergreen leaves stay all year round. A plant has a root, stem and flower it starts as a seed. Plants need water, light, heat, nutrients and space to grow healthily. If plants are healthy, they make their own food through photosynthesis. They will usually look green with shiny leaves, an upright stem and bright flowers. Seeds are important to the plants that produce them because that is how a plant reproduces.

The 4 seas and oceans that surround the UK are – The Atlantic Ocean, The North Sea, The Irish Sea and the English Channel There are 4 countries in the UK each with its own capital city – England - London, Scotland - Edinburgh, Wales - Cardiff and Northern Ireland - Belfast There are 2 polar regions. Arctic in the Northern Hemisphere and Antarctica in the Southern hemisphere. 		
South Pole	Southern most point on surface of the earth.

Explorer	Someone who travels to places about which very little is known.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Victorian era was from 1837 until 1901 while Queen Victoria was on the throne. If children were poor or orphans they lived in the workhouse where they worked for up to 12 hours a day. Robert Scott was the first British explorer to reach the South Pole and explore Antarctica The purpose of the expeditions was to find out more about the animals, the weather and the land of Antarctica. Scott used 13 sledges pulled by 23 dogs and ten ponies to carry all the supplies. He also had two motor sledges.
