Assessments

As you may be aware, Key Stage 1 SATS are no longer a statutory requirement in schools at the end of Year 2. We are therefore using the same assessment materials with the children that they have used in both the Autumn and Spring terms (PIRA and PUMA tests). The assessments provide an indication of your child's attainment that helps to inform the teacher assessment judgements for all year groups. We will continue to provide the same information regarding the children's progress as we do each term for Key Stage 1. Their assessment outcomes also provide the teachers with areas of focus for the next steps in their learning.

The children in Year 6 will have their SATS tests week beginning Monday 13th May each day. There will therefore be some changes to the timetable and staffing to facilitate the tests, following the government guidance. More information to follow about SATS breakfasts!!!

The Phonics Screening check will take place in June for Year 1 pupils. The children are not made aware that they are doing a 'test' as such, as it is carried out in a familiar way based on previous Phonics assessments.
