

Natural materials include rocks and wood. Man-made materials include lass and plastics. • Most materials have more than one property. Natural/man-made, strong/weak, strong/light, rough/smooth, shiny/dull, hard/soft. • Materials which are durable will last a long time without breaking. • Some materials can be changed by squishing, bending, twisting, and stretching.

opaque	Materials that do not let light through them.		
translucent	Materials that let some light through, but you cannot see clearly.
