<b>SCIENCE – Living Things &amp; Their Habitats</b>		<b>IMPORTANT KNOWLEDGE (Five Finger Facts)</b>	
<b>mammal</b>	An animal that breathes air, has a backbone & grows hair during its life.	Mammals give birth to live young and birds lay eggs.	
<b>amphibian</b>	Can live on land & in water.	The environment can affect the life cycle of a living thing	
<b>metamorphosis</b>	A dramatic change that some animals & insects go through during their life cycles.	Insects and amphibians go through a transformation process called metamorphosis.	
<b>reproduction</b>	Producing offspring.	There are male (stamen) and female (carpel) parts of a plant.	
<b>insect</b>	Small animal with 6 legs and no backbone	A natural scientist observes natural behaviour of plants and animals without experimentation.

<b>belief</b>	A strong view or opinion.	Many people consider 'beliefs' and 'faith' to be different things	
<b>faith</b>	A faith is any particular religion such as Christianity, Judaism or Islam.	Being a member of a religious community can affect daily life and help people make decisions.	
<b>community</b>	A particular area where a group of people live.	Some inspirational figures attribute their successes to their beliefs.	
<b>atheist</b>	A person who believes that there is no god or gods	People of different religious beliefs living in non-religious communities can sometimes face difficulties.	
<b>dilemma</b>	A difficult situation that requires a choice between two actions, neither of which will be a good solution	Within a community young people might cope with pressure to behave in a manner not according to their beliefs

<b>Workhouse</b>	A building where poor people used to work for food and shelter.	The period of Queen Victoria's Rein (the Victorian era) was 1837 – 1901	
<b>Social rules</b>	Rules expected to be followed by a particular society or culture.	The work of Dr Barnardo and 1833 Factory Act improved the lives of many children.	
<b>Impact</b>	A strong effect or influence.	Mary Seacole broke social rules and prejudices to become a nurse.	
<b>Locomotive</b>	Pulls trains & can be powered by an engine that burns diesel, fuel or by electricity.	Graham Bell's invention of the telephone influenced the progression of communication across the world.	
<b>Industrial revolution</b>	Shift in societies: products were no longer solely by hand but more by machines & factories.	George Stephenson, who built the first steam locomotive, influenced further developments in travel.
