Supervision on the Playground

Please could you ensure that you supervise your children on the playground in the mornings on arrival. Some children in Key Stage 2 have been dropped off at the gate and left to walk into school on their own. All children (except Year 6) need to be delivered to the classroom door for a handover.

Children in Year 6 are allowed to walk to school independently, so do not need an adult with them in the morning. However, if their behaviour becomes an issue whilst waiting outside their classroom, parents will be asked to supervise them moving forward.

The doors open at 8.50am for children to enter the building safely. No playground equipment should be used at this time, including balls and football/netball goals and children should not ride bikes and scooters on the playground. Thank you for supporting us to keep our community safe.
