


What a great first week last week when we welcomed everyone back to school! We loved meeting all our new children and we hope that they have felt settled and made some new friends. The children have been launched into their new topics, learning about countries in UK and Kenya in Key Stage 1, Norway in Lower Key Stage 2 and North America in Upper Key Stage 2, whilst the children in Reception are enjoying getting their teeth into 'The Gruffalo'!

Attendance

We had just four days in school last week – our whole school attendance was 96.2%.

Attendance and arriving at school on time has a direct impact on children's academic outcomes and their mental health and well-being so we always aim for our whole school attendance to be at least 96%! We understand that sometimes children really are too unwell to attend school, but if you are unsure, there is extensive government guidance to support you: Is my child too ill for school? - NHS




Music Lessons 🎜 ⋠



Jaci wrote her book to help raise funds for the 'Save the Elephants' charity and is launching it at The Station in Richmond as part of
