


GEOGRAPHY - NORWAY		IMPORTANT KNOWLEDGE (Five Finger Facts)	 
Country	Land that is controlled by a single government.	Norway is a Scandinavian country in the northern hemisphere, in the continent of Europe.	
Fjords	A long, narrow, deep inlet of the sea between high cliffs.	The climate in Norway differs depending on its location (inland and coastal)	
Erosion	When natural forces like wind, water, or ice wear away and move bits of rock, soil, and sand from one place to another.	Norway is a mountainous country with fjords between them, which were formed when glaciers eroded deep into U-shaped valleys.	
Export	Sending goods or services from one country to another for sale	Norway is a major trading nation, known for exporting petroleum, natural gas, and fish, and importing machinery and food products.	
Continent	A very large area of land on Earth, like a giant puzzle piece, where many countries and people live	The country's climate, influenced by the North Atlantic Ocean, creates a unique environment that supports a mix of Arctic and temperate species.

Source	Where something comes from or begins, or the cause of something	I know that dark is the absence of light.	
Shadow	A dark area or shape created when something blocks light.	I know that light is reflected from surfaces.

Darkness	Dark means that light is absent	I know that shadows are formed when the light from a light source is blocked by a solid object.	
RE - Sikh Rites of Passage		IMPORTANT KNOWLEDGE (Five Finger Facts)	Theme Days:
Gurdwara	A Sikh temple where Sikhs go to worship and have special ceremonies.	A Sikh's baby is not named until the mother and baby are able to travel to the gurdwara (temple) for a special ceremony called 'Naam Karan'.	Jeans for Genes Day - Friday 19 th September
Ceremony	A special event or ritual that marks an important moment in life, like naming a baby or getting married.	Sikh baptismal ceremony of Amrit happens when they are of an age where they can fully understand what this life-long commitment means.	World Mental Health Day - Friday 10 th October
Baptism	A ceremony where someone promises to follow their religion fully, like the Sikh Amrit ceremony.	A Sikh wedding ceremony is known as 'Anand Karaj' which means 'Blissful Union' and can last for several days.	Anti Bullying Week - Monday 10 th - Friday 14 th November
Funeral	A ceremony to say goodbye to someone who has died and to celebrate their life.	The final rite of passage for a Sikh is their funeral ceremony called 'Antam Sanskar' which they see as a celebration of life.	
Reincarnation	The belief that after someone dies, their soul is born again in a new body.	Sikhs believe in reincarnation which means the mortal body is just the shell for the soul which can never die.
