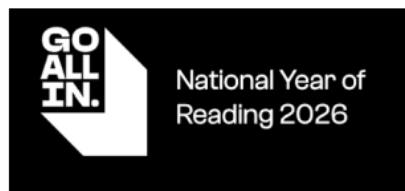


## MOORSIDE PRIMARY SCHOOL AND NURSERY NEWSLETTER
