New Devices and Online Safety



We are sure that quite a few of our children will have asked Santa for new devices for Christmas and it may be that you have already set up parental controls and discussed using them safely. It is so important to monitor them regularly so that they are not encouraging conversations with strangers or viewing inappropriate content on the internet. Some tips for supporting children with new or existing devices are:

- Set Up Devices Together: Explore privacy settings, parental controls, and safe search options with your child.
- Learn Together: Your children may know more than you do about the online world so let them teach you what they know.
- Talk About Online Safety: Discuss online behaviour, cyberbullying, and what to do if something worries them.

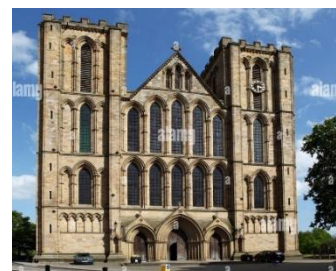
We appreciate you working with us to ensure that children don't only say what they know about keeping safe online but that they put this into action. Every week we are aware of at least one incident or scenario outside school where a child has accessed content inappropriately or shared details/information/messages that they shouldn't have with friends or strangers. Misuse of the internet can seriously affect children's mental health and well-being and this is why online safety is a priority in our curriculum.

Inhalers and Epi-pens

If your child has an inhaler or an epi-pen in school, please can you ensure that it is in date and that you monitor this to request updated medications from your GP? We do check inhalers but it would really help us (and your child) if you do too. Many thanks.

Year 5 Visit to Ripon Cathedral

Our children in Year 5 will be visiting Ripon Cathedral for the Holocaust Memorial Service at 10.30am on 27th January. The children are learning about Judaism at the moment, and this will provide them with an opportunity to commemorate the lives of the six million people who died during the Holocaust during the Second World War. Please ensure that your child is in full school uniform and has a coat to wear on that day. They will leave school at 9.45am and return in time for lunch.
