Settlement	A place where people make a community	The Anglo Saxons invaded Britain to use our fertile lands for farming.	
Invasion	Invading a country with an army	They came from Germany, Holland and Denmark in AD 449	
Tribe	A traditional society consisting of families and communities	The settlements were small villages with houses built from wood with thatched roofs	
Kingdom	A country rules by a King or a Queen.	The Anglo Saxons were led by Alfred the Great who promoted converting to Christianity and school were run in the churches.	
Converting	Change from one form to another	The Anglo-Saxon settlements moved south when the Vikings invaded from the North in 789.

Surface	The top or outside layer of something.	I know that the surface is the top or outside layer of something.	
Repel	When magnets 'repel' they push away from each other.	Contact forces occur when two objects are touching each other.	
Attract	When magnets 'attract' they move closer to each other.	A magnet has a north seeking pole (N) and a south seeking pole (S)	
Force	A force is a pull or push on an object.	Not all metals are magnets, but all magnets are metallic.	
Friction	Friction is a force that occurs when two surfaces come into contact and resist motion.	Friction forces slow down moving objects	
RE -		IMPORTANT KNOWLEDGE (Five Finger Facts)	
Representation	A picture or image that shows what someone or something might look like.	Representations of Jesus vary as no one actually knows what he looked like.	
Trust	Believing that someone is honest, kind or will do the right thing, even if you don't fully understand them.	Pictures of Jesus show people's personal beliefs about him. (For example, having kind eyes or being thin because he is not greedy.)	
Gospel	A special book in the Bible that tells the story of Jesus' life and teachings.	The gospels provide evidence of what Jesus was like as a person.	
Evidence	Clues or information that help us understand what something was like or what really happened.	While Jesus was alive, many people didn't understand him, therefore didn't trust him or like him.	
Metaphor	A way of describing something by saying it is something else to help people understand (like Jesus saying, "I am the light of the world").	Jesus used religious metaphors to describe himself such as "I am the bread of life." and "I am the light of the World."
