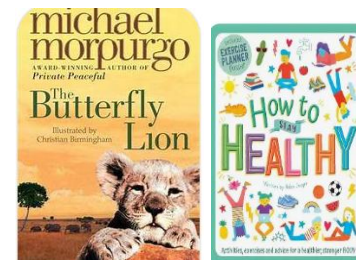

GEOGRAPHY - Comparing Ripon to Whitby

IMPORTANT KNOWLEDGE (Five Finger Facts)

Counties	A county is a large area that is divided into smaller sections for local government uses.	There are 48 counties in England with North Yorkshire being the largest.
Coastal region	Where the land meets the sea.	Whitby is a coastal region in North Yorkshire, facing the North Sea.
Human features	Things that are made or built by people.	Whitby has had a long history as a fishing port which had brought trade links and tourism to the town.
Physical features	Natural characteristics of the Earth, such as mountains, rivers, and forests.	Whitby includes a range of popular human and physical features such as the Abbey ruin, the swing bridge and the east and west piers and the cliffs, the surrounding moorlands and beaches.
Port	A place where ships come in to load and unload goods or people.	Whitby and Ripon share similar tourist appeal as historic Yorkshire towns, offering both human and physical attractions.



SCIENCE - Introduction to the human skeletons and muscles

IMPORTANT KNOWLEDGE (Five Finger Facts)

Muscles	Muscles are tissues in the body that allow movement.	All humans have a skeleton made up of many bones which are solid, strong and are various shapes.
Vertebrates	Animal that has a backbone	The skull protects the brain, the rib cage protects organs such as the heart and lungs and the spine protects the spinal cord.
Invertebrates	Animal that does not have a backbone	Our bones grow in length as we age, until we become an adult.
skeleton	A skeleton is the strong framework inside your body that gives it shape, helps you move, and protects your important organs.	Animals that have a spine inside their bodies are called vertebrates, animals that do not have bones, including a spine, inside their bodies are called invertebrates.
Organs	An organ is a part of the body made of different tissues that work together to do a special job.	Humans and most other animals have muscles throughout their bodies.

RE - What is the Bible and why is it important to Christians?

IMPORTANT KNOWLEDGE (Five Finger Facts)

Bible	The holy book for Christians that teaches them about God, Jesus, and how to live a good life.	Christians use the Bible at home and in church to learn about God and Jesus, and to receive guidance.
Church	A special place where Christians go to pray, worship God, and read the Bible.	The Bible is made up of different genres of writing, such as stories, poems, proverbs, law, songs biographies and letters.
Testament	A part of the Bible. The Old Testament is from before Jesus was born, and the New Testament is from after.	The different genres show different aspects of God, e.g. stories demonstrate God's love, power and personality and poems and songs praise God and the things He has done.
Genre	A type of writing, like a story, poem, song or letter.	The Bible is arranged chronologically so the first book was written the longest time ago and the last book was written most recently.
Guidance	Help or advice that shows people the right thing to do.	The Old Testament contains writing from before Jesus' birth and the New Testament contains writing from after.
