The season of summer occurs in June, July and August. Summer is the warmest season in the UK, but it can still be windy and rainy. Day length is longer in summer, and this means it is darker later. The longest day, when we have the most amount of daylight is June 21st.

Northern hemisphere	The half of the Earth north of the equator	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The UK is in the Northern Hemisphere, which is far away from there, so we have 4 seasons where the weather changes. There are 2 polar regions. Arctic in the Northern Hemisphere and Antarctica in the Southern hemisphere. Polar habitats have just two seasons, summer and winter (but even summer is normally very cold). Traditionally, people who lived in the Arctic survived by hunting animals for food and clothing, and by building igloos for shelter. No people permanently live in Antarctica because it is too cold for them to live there for a long time.

Polar region	The coldest parts of Earth found in the North and South poles.

Ramadan is a period of fasting that ends with Eid ul Fitr. Hajj is a special pilgrimage to Mecca all Muslims are meant to go on before they die.
