

<b>mammal</b>	A mammal is a warm-blooded animal that gives birth to live young and has hair or fur.	<b>SCIENCE:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Humans are mammals, they grow and develop inside the mother's womb for nine months until they are born.</li> <li>Children reach a variety of important milestones in how they play, learn, speak, behave and move.</li> <li>Puberty is when a child's body begins to develop and change as they become an adult and are able to reproduce.</li> <li>Humans are taller now than in the past, due to improved nutrition and health.</li> <li>During old age, bones can shrink in size, and muscles generally lose strength and flexibility.</li> </ul>	
<b>womb</b>	The womb is an organ in female mammals where offspring grow and develop.		
<b>develop</b>	To develop is to grow or change gradually.		
<b>adolescence</b>	The stage of the human life cycle that occurs between childhood and adulthood.		
<b>elder</b>	Adolescence is the stage of the human life cycle that occurs between childhood and adulthood.

<b>fossil fuels</b>	Fuels like coal, oil, and gas buried underground for millions of years. We burn them to make energy.	<b>GEOGRAPHY:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Oil, coal and gas are fossil fuels that, once used, cannot be replaced.</li> <li>Wind, sun and water are natural sources of energy (renewable) that will never run out.</li> <li>Climate change is caused by greenhouse gases (CO<sub>2</sub> and methane) which surround Earth like a blanket warming it up.</li> <li>Climate change affects changing weather, rising sea levels, water, food and animals.</li> <li>The UK currently imports and exports over 50% of goods to countries within Europe.</li> </ul>	
<b>renewable</b>	Something that can be used again and again and does not run out quickly, like energy from the sun or wind.		
<b>imports and exports</b>	Imports are things a country buys from other countries. Exports are things a country sells to other countries.		
<b>energy sources</b>	Ways we get power to run things like homes, cars and schools, such as the sun, wind, water, coal or gas.		
<b>climates</b>	The usual kind of weather a place has over a long time, like hot and dry, cold and snowy, warm and rainy.

<b>morals</b>	Principles about right and wrong that guide how people live and behave.	<b>RE:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Prophet Muhammad is an important figure in Islam as he is believed to be the messenger of God.</li> <li>Muhammad continued to receive revelations, including instructions to fast during Ramadan, to pray facing Mecca and for all people who earned a certain amount of money to make the payment of Zakat.</li> <li>Everything that Muhammad was told by God through the angel Gabriel was written down (although first it was passed to people orally) and made into the Qur'an.</li> <li>Muhammad is not only remembered for giving Muslims the Qur'an but also, for his own teachings and the morals he lived by in his daily life.</li> <li>For Muslims, Muhammad is a role-model. They try to act, think and love like Muhammad did so that they can please Allah.</li> </ul>	
<b>revelations</b>	Messages from God, given to Muhammad through the angel Gabriel.		
<b>Allah</b>	The Arabic word for God in Islam.		
<b>zakat</b>	A required payment or charity given by Muslims to help those in need.		
<b>role model</b>	Someone who others try to imitate because of their good example.
